Noosa hinterland bridges replacement program – Wahpunga Lane Bridge, Kin Kin

Project update

Following the clean-up of damage to the Wahpunga Lane Bridge work site resulting from the significant flooding event in late February, the site was hit by a second flood event in May.

These two unprecedented weather events and the flow on effect on State roads, such as temporary load limits have further delayed work. The revised construction schedule has the bridge being completed and the road reopened to traffic by mid-August. This date is dependent upon favourable weather and construction conditions.

Construction activities

Piling activities, to protect the road and bridge from long-term erosion and support the bridge foundation have restarted.



Precast concrete components such as concrete deck units, kerbs and headstocks constructed offsite will be brought onsite in coming weeks.

Traffic Diversion

Traffic will continue to be detoured via Gympie-Kin Kin Road and Sister Tree Creek Road until project completion.
