Peregian Beach, Skate Park Upgrade

Project summary

Skateboarding and scooter riding are popular activities for people of all ages in the Noosa Shire. To meet demand, Council will shortly commence an upgrade of the popular Peregian Beach Skate Park.

Council engaged Concrete Skate Parks, an experienced skate park designer, to create a design that not only satisfies the needs of users but also suits the unique footprint of the site.

Design

Designed in consultation with local skaters, the new park builds upon the benefits of the existing facility while providing improved functionality, safety, and an enhanced experience for users of all levels.

The new park will include three distinct zones:

- Zone 1 beginner bowl
- Zone 2 competition flow bowl
- Zone 3 rest area

Design

The design specialists have finalised a plan specifically tailored to complement the park's unique location.

Key considerations incorporated into the design include:

- replicating the existing footprint
- retaining the current shade sail
- minimising impact on the existing Norfolk Island Pines and coastal vegetation
- mitigating impacts within the coastal zone
- enhancing drainage for the skate bowl.

Timing and community impact

Work is scheduled to begin in May 2024 and is anticipated for completion by the end of August 2024. During this period, the skate park will be closed for safety reasons, and safety barriers will be installed to restrict access.

Access to the beach, playground, and amenities will remain open as usual.
