Old Ceylon Road, Ridgewood – reconstruction complete

Project summary

Old Ceylon Road sustained significant damage during the 2022 flooding and rain event, with multiple landslips and slumps impacting the stability of the slope near 130 Old Ceylon Road.

Noosa Council is pleased to advise FKG Civil Pty Ltd has now completed reconstruction works, with the road now restored to normal operation.

We would like to thank residents and motorists for their patience and understanding while this work was completed.

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Overview of works

Reconstruction included:

- excavation of unsuitable material
- constructing a retaining wall designed to withstand future slides.

This included supporting columns going 5.1m below ground and the wall being up to 4m above the existing road.

- a shotcrete drain at the top of the wall to redirect water
- reinstating table drain adjoining the road
- reconstructing road pavement.

Assistance to deliver this resilience project was provided through the jointly funded Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).

Other flood reconstruction works are still underway in the area. We appreciate your ongoing patience while we repair these critical hinterland assets.
